Concerning 4.12 – Cr Turver asked about the impact of the recent summer drought on the groundwater table.

Mr Blakemore indicated that in several aquifers water levels had been the lowest since records commenced. Problems had also arisen in the Battersea and Moroa areas where a number of domestic bores had dried up.

Members discussed whether there was a need to review the current permitted rule in the Freshwater Plan which allows for all underground and surface water takes of 20 cubic metres per day.

Concerning 4.6 – It was noted that copies of the draft Wairarapa Coastal Strategy will be made available to Committee members following its release by the Coastal Strategy Group for public consultation in August. It was further noted that the strategy as such would not be a statutory document.

Concerning 5.3 - Copies of the brochure 'Pest Plants Everyone's Responsibility' were tabled.

Concerning 5.5 - Mr O'Donnell advised that a letter had been received from Environment Southland inviting the Greater Wellington Regional Council to join a group of regional councils to collectively fund an application to import a product containing Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease virus.
